REPRESENTING SDGS IN CLASSROOMS

We live in an endless web of complexity where everything is intertwined. As the years pass, navigating each predicament without collective effort has become increasingly more complex. While the recent decades' worth of economic growth and technological advancement has brought us a tremendous increase in living standards and allowed us to progress by an extensive margin, these factors have also brought about many new problems and the worsening of old wounds. To battle against this, the SDGs have been formed.



Now, what are the SDGs?

SDGs are a set of goals that were unanimously established by the United Nations member states in 2015. They consist of 17 aims for the world to achieve by 2030: end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure people live in peace and prosperity. These goals have been set internationally to ensure that different parts of the world are making efforts to change and sustain resources for the next generation to come, as well as improving the lives of everyone currently. This is why we chose to discuss this topic in our class. It is of utter importance that we consider the lives that will change due to the lack of actions taken in the present.

In the first quarter of this academic year, the students of class 12 international took this understanding of the SDGs. They applied it in a serious discussion among their peers in a balloon debate. The class is divided into two teams: team what goes and team what stays. Each team must argue for or against the presence of their own respective SDGs. Each team speaker is given 3 minutes to present their arguments, followed by a 1-minute rebuttal speech from the opposing team. After this clash, the speaker is given another chance to defend their points against rebuttals from the other side. This is why our class has chosen to participate in it for our Global Perspectives class, which includes using SDG goals.

Conducting a balloon debate on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) is crucial as it actively engages students in addressing pressing global issues. This format encourages participants to research and articulate their perspectives on various SDGs, encouraging a more profound sense of critical thinking. By debating the merits of different solutions, students deepen their understanding of complex challenges and develop a sense of responsibility and initiative toward creating a more sustainable future. This experiential learning approach empowers them to become informed global citizens, ready to tackle the world's most pressing problems.

Using the topic of SDG goals for our class discussions, we can use various skills. We could deconstruct the goal at hand and evaluate our stand on it. These goals will aim for a positive impact; specifically, students on the opposing team chose and brought up interesting supporting statements, such as the efficiency gained from removing redundant SDGs. Communication and collaboration are also key, as students assist in discussions before rebutting, comparing the points they've gathered from the speech given as well. Most importantly, persuasion through evidence and presentation. To convince everyone that your stance is correct, you must present yourself to be confident in your topic by educating everyone about it.

In conclusion, after having finished these series of debates, the students were not only able to be assessed but also helped to direct their focus on improving specific skills interconnected with debating, which they lack. They also have the opportunity to learn from observing as they've been exposed to their peers' debating methods and presenting their points. Allowing them not only to learn but also to adjust and gain confidence in a formal debating setting.

Daniya Tat's Internship Journey at Paragon ISC

Meet Daniya Tat – Class of 2024, pursuing her passion for business through a six-month internship.

"Hi, my name is Daniya Tat. I just graduated from Paragon International School in 2024, and I have been interning here at Paragon International School as well.

Initially, I noticed that my IGCSE business subject was very broad, and I wanted to explore that further. That's why I decided to pursue Economics and Business for my AS and A Levels. Surprisingly, through these subjects, I was able to learn a lot."

Your outstanding IGCSE results (5A, 3A and 2A stars, A, A*, A*, A, A) are a testament to your dedication. How did achieving this inspire you to pursue a path in business?

"Because of my hard work, I managed to jump from a B to an A in Business from AS to A Levels. For Economics, I improved from a C to an A in my A Levels. This experience taught me a lot about thinking outside the box, analysing patterns, and understanding the secrets behind each question. These skills greatly helped in my studies and motivated me to excel further in the field of business."*





Why did you choose to intern in the Business Department?

"The reason I chose this department is that I studied Economics and Business in my A Levels. Additionally, I wanted to contribute to the school by aiding my under activities. It's a way to give back to the community that shaped me."

What is your typical day like in the Business Department?

"When I arrive at school, I usually check in with my supervisor to see if there's any work for me. If not, I walk around the school and sometimes meet up with my intern friends to discuss tasks.

If the Economics department doesn't have anything for me, I go to the Business department. My tasks include organising debates, digital art projects, poster making, graphic design, and grading papers for my Economics supervisor. I help wherever needed, ensuring that everything runs smoothly."

Mow has your internship helped you develop new skills?

"Personally, the internship has greatly developed my social skills. I've become more confident in talking to people and offering help. Social skills are incredibly useful in life. Knowledge is important, but being able to share and apply it is equally vital. This internship has helped me grow in this aspect."

What are your career goals?

"For my career, I want to focus more on the economic side of business. In Cambodia, many business courses are available, but there's a lack of specialised economics courses.

That's why I plan to study abroad – to bring this knowledge and opportunities back to Cambodia. My goal is to provide more options for the younger generation to explore and grow in this field."*

What advice would you give to students interested in business?

"My advice, not just for business and economics but for any goal, is to never give up easily. Give yourself a second chance. If you fail, take some time to recover, then try again. That second chance can be incredibly rewarding, and it's worth the effort to push through."

What inspired you to pursue science, and how did that passion develop over time?

Initially, I was not very interested in science. I was more into the social sciences. At one point, I even wanted to be a lawyer or a diplomat. The moment that kickstarted my interest in science was in eighth grade when a teacher kept asking "why," which really got me curious about the intricate nature of science itself. That curiosity grew over time, especially during my high school years. I did A-level biology and chemistry, and the complex nature of the syllabus content gave me a sense of curiosity. I would always try to find out why something happened, and I wouldn't stop until I was satisfied with the answer. To me, that's what science is all about—building upon the question "why."

Why did you choose to intern in the Science Department?

Around the time I graduated, a teacher introduced me to the idea of interning at school. I had also seen my seniors intern at school for the past few years. I thought that interning would give me an idea of what goes on behind the scenes in the science lab, especially in both chemistry and biology. As students, we don't really know what happens in the background, so I was very interested in learning the intricacies of the science labs. I also believed it would be a valuable learning experience, not just in science but also in terms of gaining work experience. It gave me a glimpse into what a real-life workplace is like, and school provided a safe environment to make mistakes and grow as a person.








My daily tasks include taking care of the equipment in the lab, maintaining its quality, and checking if it works. Of course, this involves cleaning the equipment to keep it neat and tidy. Another task is helping prepare for any experiments that teachers or students may need, especially since their syllabus involves a lot of practicals. I assist them in preparing for these exams and practicals. During the practical sessions, I'm on standby in the lab to assist students if they need anything or have questions about the equipment, the lab, or the content itself.

What's the most important thing you've learned during your internship?

The most important thing I've learned is not science itself but rather working in a workplace. This internship has prepared me for the real world by giving me a demo of a real-life workplace. I've also noticed that I've grown emotionally and mentally. When I first started, it felt awkward to be back at school, not as a student but as a member of staff. Over time, I slowly immersed myself in the role of a lab assistant, which gave me a lot of personal growth and development that I feel will be essential for my future workplace experiences.



Right now, the future is uncertain because I don't have one clear path yet. I plan to pursue a science degree because I believe it will provide many options and opportunities for different pathways. Realistically, in five years, I hope to see myself completing my degree and doing what future me wants to do. I do have a rough idea—I'd like to be involved in research or education, but who knows what the future holds?

What advice would you give to younger students who want to pursue science?

The first step is always the hardest, but once you decide to pursue science, the rest will come easier. Like any other field, you need a lot of commitment and responsibility toward your studies. Work hard, study hard, and don't slack off. Don't be afraid to try and experiment because that's what science is all about. Never hesitate to ask questions. Don't be shy, and never stop asking yourself the question "why."

Could you introduce yourself to the audience?

My name is Bonita, and I'm a recent graduate from Paragon International School. I am currently interning as an assistant to my math supervisor in the math department.

What inspired you to focus on mathematics?

What inspired me is that I love to learn. The love of teaching people inspires me to understand the world's mysteries. So, that's what drove me: my general fascination drives me.

Why did you choose to intern in the Math Department?

Can you describe a typical day during your internship?

Model United Nations (MUN) is more than just an educational simulation; it's a transformative experience that challenges students to think critically, collaborate effectively, and communicate persuasively. By stepping into the roles of diplomats, participants engage in high-stakes debates on pressing global issues, fostering skills that extend far beyond the conference room.





The Power of Preparation

Success in MUN hinges on thorough preparation. Before the event, participants undergo rigorous training to master the formal rules of procedure, the structure of international relations, and the language of diplomacy. Through a series of seminars and simulated sessions, students refine their debate strategies, enhance their research abilities, and familiarise themselves with the nuances of parliamentary procedure.

Mock debates serve as a crucial component of this preparation, allowing participants to navigate the pressure of real-time negotiations. While the initial sessions may feel daunting, each practice round builds confidence, transforming uncertainty into well-structured, persuasive arguments. Students gradually develop the poise and expertise required for MUN success by honing skills such as resolution drafting and collaborative problem-solving.







Overcoming Challenges

Despite the benefits of rigorous preparation, the journey to MUN excellence has hurdles. One of the most significant challenges faced by participants was scheduling conflicts. With packed academic calendars, finding time for consistent mock sessions proved difficult. However, these limitations only heightened training intensity, reinforcing the importance of adaptability and time management.

Students also had to navigate the unpredictable nature of live debates. MUN is not a scripted event; it demands quick thinking, strategic decision-making, and the ability to respond dynamically to unfolding discussions. Learning to improvise and handle unexpected challenges was a key takeaway for many participants.







A Global Perspective

The heart of MUN lies in understanding complex geopolitical landscapes and seeking diplomatic solutions. Discussions centred around the Taiwan Strait for this particular event, which required deep research into historical contexts, key stakeholders, and potential global ramifications. Delegates explored multiple perspectives, recognising that true diplomacy is finding common ground amidst differing national interests.

Lessons Beyond the Debate

Beyond improving public speaking and negotiation skills, MUN instilled invaluable life lessons. Participants learned to prioritise tasks efficiently, collaborate under pressure, and analyse international issues with a critical eye.
